It is fantastic to be back on the podium with the singers of the Brisbane Concert Choir. I would like to thank Ross Jelf for leading the singers through a very rewarding season.

This evening's programme is filled with beauty, bells, and bright lights. We begin our evening back in the sixteenth

Century with the sacred Christmas carol. Gaudete! The repetitive refrain. "Gaudete! Christus est natus". translates as "Rejoice, rejoice! Christ is born". The piece features each section of the choir in a Gregorian chant-like melody, interspersed within several refrains

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songs published in 1582. In *Behold New* Joy the melodies of *Personent hodie*, In *dulci jubilo*, *Ecce novum gaudium*, and *Corde natus ex parentis*, come together to create a majestic and stirring setting accompanied by organ, transporting us back to the sixteenth Century.

One of the greatest music masters of

the late sixteenth to seventeenth early Centuries is Giovanni Gabrieli (c. 1557-1612). In the last decade of his life, Gabrieli was residing in Venice where the waning traits of the Renaissance period were being challenged by the new style of

which drives the rhythmic energy in a mixed meter feel, governed by the stresses of the Latin text.


Both *Gaudete* and the carols in *Behold New Joy* appear in the *Piae Cantiones*, a collection of Finnish/Swedish sacred the Baroque period. His motet, *O Jesu mi dulcissime* ("O Jesus, my sweetest"), illustrates a mixture of these two styles. Set for double choir and continuo, this chromatic *madrigal* features beautiful harmonic nuances. Inspired by the sacred text, the musical lines are

magnificently formed to create beautiful melodic lines which intertwine to create a perfect whole.

We are delighted to have the Brisbane Bells joining us this evening. Rutter's *All bells in paradise* introduces the Bells as they perform the first of their brackets.

Award winning Ola Gjeilo (b. 1978), is known for his cinematic sounds in choral music. Serenity takes the text of O magnum mysterium ("O great mystery") and sets the choral parts with a solo violin. The opening creates stillness in the spacious harmonies sung to the syllables of the words "O magnum mysterium". The violin enters and takes the music to great heights as the choir gravitates to the violin's register. As with many of Gjeilo's pieces, the symmetrical impulse of the format of the piece as a whole, allows the music to drift back down and hovers to its end on "Alleluia".

Now that your ears have been cleansed by the pureness of Gjeilo, we present



the Christmas motets of Francis Poulenc (1899-1963). These miniatures paint four colourful scenes from the nativity story. *O magnum mysterium* begins the set, and once again, it is the harmonies that create the great mystery in this text. Poulenc sets up a gentle harmonic movement across the



lower three sections of the chorus, over which the soprani section provide us with a melodic line that seems so seamless, even though its internal intervallic line is not what would usually be associated with a seamless line.

In the second piece, the text, *Quem vidistis*, makes two demands of the shepherds: "Who did you see?" is set with a searching quaver movement, and by contrast, the "Speak... and proclaim the birth of Christ" acts like a trumpet blast. In the third piece, the crystalline refrain of *Videntes stellam* evokes a calm and starlit night, through which the Magi travel with growing excitement. This reaches a rich climax as they enter the stable and present their gifts; outside the star shines on, undisturbed. In the final motet, *Hodie Christus natus est*, the faithful make their response to the news with unbuttoned exuberance: "Gloria in excelsis Deo".

The words of Christina Rossetti conclude the Concert Choir's section of the programme in Cecilia McDowall's setting of the text "Before the paling of the stars".

Thank you for your delightful singing this evening and I look forward to talking to you over refreshments downstairs at the end of the performance. It has been a pleasure to work with the Brisbane Bells and their conductors Barbara McGeever and Samantha Cook.

The Choir

The Brisbane Concert Choir at St Andrew's is an auditioned adult mixed voice choir. Formed in 1996, the Choir has established an excellent reputation for its performances of diverse repertoire ranging from a cappella pieces to full symphonic works.

Performances have included appearances with The Queensland Orchestra, Queensland Pops Orchestra and in prestigious festivals such as Brisbane Cathedrals Week and the 4MBS Festival of Classics. The Choir toured the North Island of New Zealand in 1999 and in June 2002, following the release of its first CD, *Journey*, the Choir embarked on a very successful tour to north Queensland.

2008 saw the release of a second CD, *Radiance*, and a first European tour which visited Prague, Salzburg and Vienna. The Choir toured to Italy in September 2011, where it was very well received and in December of that year, the Choir released a CD of music for the festive season, entitled *Rejoice*!

The Choir has recorded performances for broadcast on ABC TV and 4MBS Classic-FM.

DEBRA SHEARER-DIRIÉ MUSICAL DIRECTOR

Originally from Perth, Western Australia, Dr Debra Shearer-Dirié maintains an active career as a choral conductor, music educator, clinician, scholar and editor. She holds a Master of Music Education degree and Doctor of Music degree in Choral Conducting from Indiana University in the United States. During her time at Indiana University she was director of the Indiana University Children's and Youth Choir; assistant director to maestro Paul Hillier with the Pro Arte Singers; and Director of the International Vocal Ensemble at Indiana University for two consecutive years.

Upon arriving in Brisbane mid-2003, Debra conducted the Queensland Young Conservatorium Chamber Choir through diverse repertoire which led them to an invitation to perform at the ANCA conference in 2004. In 2005, she was appointed Musical Director of the Brisbane Concert Choir, a 60 voice adult auditioned choir, and in 2006 she founded the Vox Pacifica Chamber Choir, which toured Tasmania in 2006 with several well-received performances, including appearances at the National ANCA conference.

In 2009, Debra founded Fusion Vocal Ensemble, which has become known for its performances of diverse repertoire with exceptional beauty. Fusion was one of only three Australian choirs to be invited to perform at the 5th World Forum on Music in Brisbane in 2013. In August 2014, Fusion was one of twenty-five international choirs who were selected to perform at the World Symposium on Choral Music in Seoul, Korea.

In her work as Musical Director of the Brisbane Concert Choir, Fusion and Vintage Voices, Debra continually searches for opportunities to extend her singers in innovative ways. This may be in collaboration with other musical groups, composers, dancers, visual artists, multi-media experts, and cultural groups to challenge both herself as a musician and educator, and those that work with her.

Debra has lectured at the Queensland Conservatorium, the University of Queensland School of Music, and the Australian Catholic University. She currently serves as editor of the Australian National Choral Association's publication, *Sing Out*, and is on the board for the National Council of that organization.

BRISBANE BELLS

Brisbane Bells was formed in 2007 by director Samantha Cook. The aim of the association is to promote handbell ringing in the Brisbane community and encourage local composers to write music for handbells. Most of our members have some form of musical training or play other instruments, and all share a joy in collaborative music making. Brisbane Bells work regularly with Brisbane choirs, and have performed with Ignite Choir, Thomas Cantley Singers, Brisbane Chamber Choir and St Peter's Chorale. Brisbane Bells currently has two large ensembles which rehearse at Coorparoo Secondary College on Tuesday evenings. New members to the group are always welcome. 


BARBARA MCGEEVER CONDUCTOR
