In Glorious Company

The music of George Frideric Handel (1685-1759) has had a major influence on the choral, orchestral and chamber music composed within the centuries that have followed. Particularly in his oratorio settings, Handel led the way to bring the dramatic effects from the early opera genre, into the sacred

settings of the oratorio. His Israel in Egypt (1739), Messiah (1742), and Saul (1739) are of course amongst some of his greatest settings in this genre.

Handel's *Dettingen Te Deum*, although not an oratorio, brings similar dramatic effects into this canticle setting. The piece was named after the British army and its allies, under the command of King George II and Lord Stair, which won a victory at the Battle of Dettingen in 1743. Handel, as *Composer of the Musick to the Chapel Royal*, was commissioned to write this work as a public thanksgiving.

Although not strictly a *Te Deum*, it consists of eighteen short movements

alternating alto and baritone solo and chorus. The first movement opens in typical Handelian style with the five part chorus entering with grandiose chords on the text "We praise thee, O God." The mood changes to a more energetic joyful line by the alto soloist. The second movement, *All the earth*

doth worship Thee, leads to a simple plaintive movement, To thee all angels cry aloud, with the soprano section singing the angelic line, answered by the

groundedness of the men's line, giving us the illusion of heaven and earth.

The majestical nature of the baritone solo movement on the text "Thou art the King of glory," presents a dialogue between the solo voice and a solo trumpet line. The lines are well crafted, dancing with each other before leading into a choral section which consolidates

the triumphant nature of this text.

setting, including the movement of the melody, the harmonic movement, the instrumental setting, and the text in this middle section acts as a pillar for this work. I encourage you to read the text before listening to these movements so that the full extent of this music can be enjoyed. The final movements lead us to a joyous end, combining full orchestral and choral forces to conclude the work.

The works that make up the first part of today's programme, stem from the monumental composers of Baroque, Classical, and Romantic periods that followed Handel. Charles Hubert Hastings Parry (1848-1918) is best known for his Jerusalem. Please join us in our performance of this piece today. His setting of the text "My soul, there is a country far beyond the stars" (by Henry Vaughan) comes from his Songs of Farewell, which combines gentle comforting sections, dancelike sections celebrating the life beyond this earth. Vaughan Williams' setting of the Old Hundredth Psalm is stirring in this combination of choir, trumpets and organ with a mixture of α



cappella and accompanied sections.

Our *In Glorious Company* programme could not be complete without a work of John Ireland (1879-1962). His setting of *Greater love hath no man* lifts up to great heights repeatedly throughout the piece, but takes us to the ultimate height with the words "Ye are washed, ye are sanctified, ye are justified, in the name of the Lord Jesus."

DEBRA SHEARER-DIRIÉ

Musical Director, Brisbane Concert Choir



Originally from Perth, Dr Debra Shearer-Dirié maintains an active career as a choral conductor, music educator, clinician and scholar. She holds a Master of Music Education degree and Doctor of Music degree in Choral Conducting from Indiana University. During her time there she directed the Indiana University Children's and Youth Choir, was assistant director to maestro Paul Hillier with the Pro Arte Singers, and Director of the International Vocal Ensemble at Indiana University for two years. From 2000 to 2001, she conducted the Northwest Girlchoir in Seattle, which performs frequently with the Seattle Symphony Orchestra.

Debra has received numerous invitations to present at national conferences both abroad and in Australia, including the National Conference of the American Choral Director's Association in New York in 2003, and has been invited to present at each Australian National Choral Association (ANCA) Choralfest since she has returned to Australia in 2003.

Upon arriving in Brisbane mid 2003, she conducted the Queens-land Young Conservatorium Chamber Choir. In 2005, she was appointed Musical Director of Brisbane Concert Choir, and in 2006 founded Vox Pacifica Chamber Choir. In 2009 she founded Fusion, a semi-professional adult a capella ensemble. She continually searches for opportunities to collaborate with other musical groups, composers, dancers, visual artists and cultural groups. Debra's most recent vocal ensemble is Vintage Voices, a program for older people in the community to join in song. She began leading this group 18 months ago.

Debra has lectured at the Queensland Conservatorium, The University of Queensland School of Music, and in 2013 will be teaching at the Australian Catholic University and serving as editor of the ANCA journal *Sing Out*, and on the National Council for ANCA. Debra is in demand as an adjudicator, clinician and conductor for festivals and eisteddfods throughout Australia and the Asia-Pacific region.

SHAUN DORNEY

Director of Music, Brisbane Regional Youth Orchestra



Shaun is the Director of Music of the Brisbane Regional Youth Orchestra (BRYO), a title he has held now for two decades. This year marks BRYO's 30th Anniversary and to celebrate, the concert on 3rd August will feature an orchestra made from BRYO's alumni.

Shaun has also been the Musical Director for numerous music camps and festivals across the nation, having been the Music Coordinator for the South East Region, Education Queensland for 23 years. He is the Co-Director of Music for the McGregor Summer School at the University of Southern Queensland and has received a Fellowship to this university for his dedication to music education and the promotion of music exchange. Shaun's tours and exchanges include touring with BRYO to perform at the World Expo 2010, to New Zealand in 2012, and as Director of Music for the Logan Youth Music Exchange to Japan, Taiwan and China eight times.



RACHELLE LEE
Conductor, BRYO's Vivace

Rachelle studied orchestral conducting with Ralph Hultgren, Patrick Pickett and Roland Yeuong, and choral conducting with Cathy Owen. She currently conducts BRYO's Vivace Chamber Orchestra, BRYO's Scherzo Strings and the many string orchestras at Canterbury College in her role there as string teacher.

Kendal holds a Bachelor of Music Studies from the Queensland Conservatorium, studying orchestral conducting with Peter Morris and Peter Francis and choral conducting with Emily Cox. She currently works at the Queensland Symphony Orchestra in the marketing department.



SHAUN BROWN

Baritone



Shaun Brown has a Bachelor of Education and Graduate Diplomas in both Opera and Vocal Performance from the Queensland Conservatorium of Music, Griffith University, where he studied with eminent voice teacher Joseph Ward OBE. A recipient of one of the inaugural Lord Mayor's Performing Arts Fellowships, Shaun travelled to England and Italy to further his vocal and language studies. On his return he was awarded the 1999 Italian Opera Award, which enabled him to study for the first half of 1999 at the Teatro Communale in Bologna. In 1999 he also won the Dame Joan Sutherland Vocal Competition, was a finalist in the Metropolitan Opera Awards, the German Opera Award and the Herald Sun Aria.

Shaun has performed numerous roles with Opera Queensland, including in *Sweeney Todd*, Morales in *Carmen*, Antonio in *Le Nozze di Figaro*, Count Paris in *Romeo et Juliette* and Dr Falke in *Die Fledermaus*. 2005 saw him return to Germany after he won the German-Australian Liederfest which gave him the opportunity to sing in concerts around Germany.

In 2008, Shaun took up a position as a Vocal Lecturer at the University of Queensland and work as a vocal teacher at the Queensland Young Conservatorium. During this year Shaun was in demand as an adjudicator in both choral and vocal eisteddfods as well as performing solo roles in the *Durufle Requiem*, Haydn's *The Seasons* and in a modern opera, *Miracle in Brisbane* for the Brisbane Festival. 2010 and 2011 were highlighted by performances with Opera Queensland in *The Merry Widow, La Fanciulla del West, Cosi fan tutte*. Shaun was offered a Teaching Fellowship at the University of North Texas where he was in residence for a year before returning to renew his collaboration with Opera Queensland in *The Mikado* and *Carmen*. Performances in Sydney with Musica Viva and Verdi's *Requiem*, Britten's *War Requiem* and Handel's *Te Deum* in Brisbane are scheduled for this year.



BRISBANE CONCERT CHOIR



The Brisbane Concert Choir at St Andrew's is an auditioned adult mixed voice choir. Formed in 1996 by Dr Guy Jansen, the Choir has established an excellent reputation for its performances of diverse repertoire ranging from a cappella pieces to full symphonic works. Performances have included appearances with The Queensland Orchestra, Queensland Pops Orchestra and in prestigious festivals such as Brisbane Cathedrals Week and the 4MBS Festival of Classics. The Choir toured the North Island of New Zealand in 1999 and in June 2002, following the release of its first CD, Journey, the Choir embarked on a very successful tour to north Queensland. 2008 saw the release of a second CD, Radiance, and a first European tour which visited Prague, Salzburg and Vienna. The Choir toured to Italy in September 2011, where it was very well received and in December of that year, the Choir released a CD of music for the festive season, entitled Rejoice! The Choir has recorded performances for broadcast on ABC-TV and 4MBS Classic-FM.
