Dr Debra Shearer-Dirié



Dr. Debra Shearer-Dirié, originally from Perth, Western Australia, is currently established in Brisbane. With a Bachelor of Music Education degree from the University of Western Australia, Dr Shearer-Dirié began her teaching career in the public and private elementary and high schools of WA. Here she taught both instrumental and choral music. After an exciting encounter with the teachers from the Kodály Intezét in Kecskemét, Hungary, she was accepted into the diploma program and spent the academic year of 1990-91 studying in Hungary. The high standard of music education that she observed there made her eager to return to her own

country to develop a similar system. She was invited to give several in-service sessions for the music educators in WA and was a clinician for the Australian Kodály Society to assist in spreading the word of Kodály and improving the standard of music education in Australia.

Dr Shearer-Dirié holds a Master of Music Education and Doctorate of Music degrees from Indiana University in the United States.. After the completion of a Master of Music Education she turned her sights to choral conducting in pursuit of a Doctoral Degree (with minors in Music Education, Ethnomusicology, and Music History). While studying conducting with Mr Robert Porco, Dr Thomas Dunn and Dr Jan Harrington, Dr Shearer-Dirié became experienced in a broad selection of music. With such a profound composition department at Indiana University, Dr Shearer-Dirié also premiered several contemporary works such as: Jason Haney's An Die Musik, Gerardo Dirié's All is Water and Tonos de Archangel.

During her time at Indiana University she was director of the Indiana University Children's and Youth Choir; assistant director to Paul Hillier with the Pro Arte Singers; and director of the International Vocal Ensemble at Indiana University for two consecutive years. From 2000-2001 she was selected as Artistic Director of the Northwest Girlchoir in Seattle Symphony Orchestra, directed by Gerard Schwarz.

After completing her dissertation, Dr Shearer-Dirié was invited to present at the National Conference of the American Choral Director's Association in New York 2003, and at the Australian National Choral Association (ANCA) National conferences in 2004 and 2006. She was appointed Musical Director of Brisbane Concert Choir, and in 2006 founded the Vox Pacifica Chamber Choir, a 16 voice auditioned youth chamber choir. In 2009 she founded Fusion, an adult a capella ensemble. She teaches at the Undergraduate and Graduate levels at the University of Queensland as well as mentoring young conductors in the Queensland region. She is in demand as an adjudicator, clinician, educator and conductor. In 2007 and 2008, Dr Shearer-Dirié served as guest editor for the ANCA National Journal and currently serves on the Queensland State ANCA committee. Her work in 2008 took her to Perth, Copenhagen, New Zealand, Canberra and Europe.

The Brisbane Concert Choir at St Andrew's is an auditioned adult mixed voice choir. Formed in 1996 by Dr Guy Jansen, the choir has established an excellent reputation for its performances of diverse repertoire ranging from a cappella pieces to full symphonic works. Performances have included appearances with The Queensland Orchestra, Queensland Pops Orchestra and in prestigious festivals such as Brisbane Cathedrals Week and the 4MBS Festival of Classics. The Choir toured the North Island of New Zealand in 1999 and in June 2002, following the release of its first CD, Journey, the choir embarked on a very successful tour to north Queensland. The choir has recorded performances for broadcast on ABC-TV and 4MBS Classic-FM. 2008 saw the release of a new CD, Radiance, and a first European tour to Prague, Salzburg and Vienna. Plans are currently afoot for the next tour in 2011.

Soprano — Melinda van der Meulen

Soprano Melinda van der Meulen graduated with a Masters degree from the Queensland Conservatorium in 2005 after also studying at the University of Southern Queensland, the Australian National Academy of Music, Melbourne, the Guildhall School of Music and Drama, London and the OPERAPLUS Summer School in Belgium.

She has been a finalist and won prizes in some of Australia's most prestigious singing competitions including the Australian Singing Competition's Mathy Awards, the Dame Joan Sutherland Scholarship, the Sydney Cultural Council's Opera Arts and Support Group Vocal Scholarship and the Elwyn Barber Scholarship. While studying she was also awarded the Sir Mostyn Hanger Scholarship, the Sir William Horace Keats Prize, the Margaret Howat Green Prize and the Elizabeth Muir Scholarship.

Her operatic roles include Queen of the Night and First Lady (*Die Zauberflöte*) for English Touring Opera, Valencienne (*Die lustige Witwe*) and Zerlina (*Don Giovanni*) for London's premier touring company Pavilion Opera, Semele (*Semele*) and Jasmine (Australian premiere) (*Going into Shadows*) for the Queensland Conservatorium and Pamina (*Die Zauberflöte*), Dido (*Dido and Aeneas*) and Phyllis (*Iolanthe*) for the USQ Opera Studio.

Melinda has performed in concert with the Australian Opera and Ballet Orchestra at the Sydney Opera House, the Queensland Orchestra with the Queensland Choir (*Carmina Burana*), the Brisbane Concert Choir and St Andrew's Sinfonia (Bach's *Magnificant* and



Christmas Concert), the Brisbane Philharmonic Orchestra and the Queensland University Musical Society (Dona Nobis Pacem) and the Camerata of St John's in the Australian premiere of Olivero's Achot Ketana. She has also appeared in concert with the acclaimed ensemble, the Southern Cross Soloists and been a featured artist at a tsunami fundraising concert at Australia House, London.

Oratorio performances include Haydn's Seven Last Words from the Cross, Handel's Messiah and Samson and Bach's St Matthew Passion (Bach Society of Queensland), Beethoven's Mass in C (Brisbane Chorale), Fauré Requiem and Vivaldi Gloria (Sunshine Coast Choral Society), Mozart Requiem (Noosa Chorale) and Mozart Mass in C (Queensland Conservatorium).

Soprano — Jacqueline Fell

Jacqueline Fell graduated from the Biola Conservatory of Music in Los Angeles, California. She received a Bachelor of Arts degree in music with a voice emphasis. She has toured around the world with Biola Chorale in 2007 and 2008. Jackie has been a part of the casts of *The Merry Wives of Windsor*. 2008, *Carmen*: 2007, *The Magic Flute*: 2006, and *Les Miserables*: 2005. Jackie also toured Europe with the Continental Singers in 2003. She has a love and appreciation for music and enjoys singing whenever given the chance. Jackie and her husband are in Brisbane while he studies to receive his masters at the University of Queensland.

Tenor — Jack Parakh-Morgan

Jack manages to combine solo work around South-east Queensland with Opera Queensland Chorus duties and Brisbane Concert Choir performances. After almost a lifetime of experience and enjoyment in music, he still takes immense pleasure in being part of this celebration.

Piano - John Woods

John was born in Stirling, Scotland and studied at the Royal Scottish Academy of Music and Drama, Glasgow, and the Royal Northern College of Music, Manchester. Prior to joining the staff of the Queensland Conservatorium he worked for the RNCM, the Hong Kong Academy for Performing Arts and Granada Television. He has accompanied singers and instrumentalists throughout the UK, Europe and Australia, on the concert platform and in radio and television broadcasts, and has also accompanied the master classes of several distinguished musicians including Dame Joan Sutherland, Dame Janet Baker and Dame Elisabeth Schwarzkopf.

Programme Notes

At approximately this same time last year some of the singers of the Brisbane Concert Choir were at the end of their fabulous tour through Prague, Salzburg and Vienna. The image on our flyers shares with you some of the wonderful sights of our tour. It was wonderful singing in those beautiful acoustics of Europe and being rugged up in coats, scarves and gloves singing Christmas Carols. But I have to say that it gives me great pleasure to present this evening's programme here in St Andrew's Uniting Church in Brisbane, and perform two of the most beautiful works associated with the Christmas Season – Handel's *Laudate pueri Dominum* and Respighi's *Laud to the Nativity*. And I am even more excited to present to you three beautiful soloists in Melinda van der Meulen, Jackie Fell, and Jack Parakh-Morgan.

Laudate pueri Dominum (O praise the Lord, ye Children) is part of a greater compiled work that some may know as Handel's Vespers or the Carmelite Vespers. This eight movements work for soprano soloists, chorus and orchestra takes the words of Psalm 112. Typical aspects of the Baroque musical style can be seen in the way Handel lays out the formal structure of each movement. The work begins with a rather civilized orchestral opening in which the soprano soloist enters with a flutter of notes, which is then echoed by the chorus. There is some very virtuosic oboe writing through this work, often presenting itself in conversations with the soprano (as in the second movement *Sit nomen Domini*) or shines above the orchestral foundation. The sun rises in the third movement with an uplifting opening with what seems like one never ending line of running notes.

This work has several uplifting texts which run one after the other. This is the case as we move into the fourth movement – *Excelsus super omnes* (High above all nations) which is set in a gigue-like style with the two oboes providing an ongoing conversation with the soprano solo. This light-hearted skip through the movement is confronted with the fifth movement and full forces demanding "Quis? Quis sicut Dominus?" (Who? Who is like the Lord our God?) The soprano soloists offers an answer to this in *Suscitans a terra*." The entire work ends with an uplifting *Gloria Patri*.

Laud to the Nativity by Ottorino Respighi is a cantata for soprano (Angel), mezzo soprano (Mary) and tenor (Shepherd) soloists, chorus (with a large



part featuring the male section of the choir) and a small chamber ensemble consisting of woodwind instruments and piano 4-hands, which was composed in 1930. Respighi uses a text of Jacopone da Todi (c. 1236-1306), a Franciscan friar from Umbria, Italy. Respighi is known as one from the Neo-Classical school. In this work he brings together styles from the Renaissance, Baroque, Classical and some of the most inspiring harmonic writing of his time. He combined these elements together in such a seamless way leading the listener through the vignettes of the birth of Christ. The combination of woodwind instruments almost gives us a "pure" slate for the story to unfold, creating some wonderful timbres to highlight the text, for example, the pastoral quality of the oboe in the opening section to the brilliance of the high woodwind instruments accompanied by four hands on the piano. The final section is too breathtaking to write about and I will allow your ears to be fulfilled by this lovely tale.

To compliment these two larger works we have included some of our favourite Christmas carols and of course this evening's concert could not be complete without your wonderful singing!

I wish you the most festive and peaceful Christmas season and look forward to seeing you all in 2010.


